## V. PRESENTATIONS

2. Receive a Presentation from Board Member Mae Parrish on Senior housing issues, and hold discussion:

- Per Board Member Watts's presentation-
  - Recently I talked with a woman who works for Angels for Elders, a company that provides home visits to senior adults in their late 60's through their 90's. She told me that many people are bringing their older parents out of senior communities into their homes because of fears the Coronavirus is rampant in these institutions and feel their loved ones will be safer at home with family. In other cases, older adults choose to age-in-place at home by themselves.
  - There is a growing demand for home-health workers. Home-health companies can't keep up with the need to help families with elderly members at home or those seniors who choose to age-in-place. In some cases, family and friends are filling the gap brought on by the caregiver shortage for home care.
  - Churches sometimes help with home modifications. One is 1st Baptist Church of Wimberley which has formed an outreach group called Carpenter's Helpers. They help older adults adapt their homes with grab bars and other home safety changes.
  - There are several senior active living communities in central Texas including Overlook at Plum Creek in Kyle, Creekside in Buda and Kissing Tree in San Marcos. However, the cost of housing in Kissing Tree for example is out of reach for lower income and many middle-income seniors. House prices there are escalating by as much as 20% year to year.
  - For those who can't or don't want to maintain a house, there are apartment communities in San Marcos including Stonebrook, Mariposa, La Vista, and Sunrise. For those requiring assisted living, two Brookdale locations and the new Sage Brook community are available. But they are not inexpensive.
  - Older San Marcos residents living in old homes throughout San Marcos, are threatened by of the increasing cost of living. Some are being forced to sell their homes. Those homes are quickly bought and rehabbed to suit the demand for housing by people relocating to San Marcos.
  - Affordable housing has become a hot topic in San Marcos due in large part to the number of apartments being built in the community for students. There's resentment by some long-time residents that no plans have been made to address the problem. Seniors on fixed incomes are hardest hit.
  - Note: According to Matrix, a resource used by Realtors, there are 4,451 adults 65-74+ living in San Marcos which is a little more than 10% of the population. A breakout of income was not available at the time this report was done.
